THE STORY BEHIND A MURDER BALLAD

Murder ballads are considered to be the original vehicle for true crime story-telling. Dating back to the 17th century, the genre first gained popularity across Europe then immigrated with Irish and Scottish settlers to the Appalachian region of the United states and spread from there. Murder ballads aren't simply stories of made up crimes, like the Dixie Chicks tune, Goodbye Earl; they are real-life crimes retold through music, like Delia's Gone by Johnny Cash. Similar to the current trend of true-crime TV and podcasts, murder ballads sensationalized stories about people being murdered for various transgressions, typically crimes against the patriarchy or church.

Now enter *Murder Ballad the musical*, written by Julia Jordan and Juliana Nash. Listen as our cast tells a tale "where good does not prevail." A tale of love lost and gained, jealousy, denial, betrayal, and death; fitting the traditional murder ballad style. We also witness our characters deal with post-partum depression, stalking, toxic masculinity, and abuse. Murder Ballad is incredibly relevant, touching on these issues many of us face. And, like any good story of mischief and murder, will likely leave you thinking, "I should've seen that coming!!"
